THE PROCESS

JUNE 2017: The National Council for Development Aid (multistakeholder advisory body to Ministry of Foreign Affairs) asks that a working group is established to draft the GCE National Strategy

JULY 2017: The Ministry of Foreign Affairs sets up a multistakeholders group and tasks the Province of Trento and a network of NGOs (AOI/Concord Italia) to coordinate works

AUG 2017 - JAN 2018: Tens of subjects, among which insitutions, universities, civil society organisations, single people, etc at local, national and international Level contribute to discussing and drafting the document


28 FEB 2018: The document is approved by the he National Council for Development Aid





AIMS OF THE STRATEGY

The document:



Promotes a structural and non-fragmented implementation of concrete actions urging all actors to seek and support ECG initiatives

- Calls for synergist coordination between the various subjects to promote GCE as an integral part of the learning experience at every level
- Promotes public debate and quality information on global issues
- Recalls the need to adopt an integrated approach with other Italian strategies with particular attention to the aspects of inclusion and sustainability

- Adopt a systemic approach that links social, cultural, economic, technological, environmental, and political aspects.
- Offer coordination, guidelines, opportunities for exchange.
- Develop pluriannual planning documents at all administrative levels.
- Develop trainings (teachers, school managers, public off icials, adult education, etc.), applied research, monitoring systems.
- Capitalise on NGOs competencies, as well as all existing experiences in formal, nonformal and informal education.
- Promote integrated tools for long-term funding.
- Pursue active partnerships with subjects from other places and cultures.

WHAT HAPPENS: THE NEXT STEPS

First 6 months:

- Establishment of a Steering committee.
- Definition by involved Ministeries (Foreign Affairs, Education and Environment) of a National Action Plan for the implementation of the Strategy, including a yearly monitoring plan.
- Active participation to international networks on relevant topics (e.g. Global Education Network Europe, and Sustainable Development Goals).

Following 8 months:

Definition of sub-national Action Plans (regions, towns, ect.) for the implementation of the Strategy.

From the 12th month:

Evaluation of state of implementation of the Strategy and promotion of yearly technical seminars.
